Course Description

This training discusses how to investigate identity thefts and encompasses the importance of digital evidence as it relates to the investigation of criminal offenses. This course is designed to be a beginner course. It will cover an overall perspective of the recognition and importance of digital evidence, cell towers, cell phones, and emerging technology considerations and how those are used in connection with committing identity thefts.

By the end of the course officers should be able to discuss how digital evidence relates to crimes by the recognition of various types of digital forums. In addition, officers will be able to preserve, seize, and secure evidence properly so the evidence is left intact in accordance with best forensic practices so it will not be suppressed in court. Many different legal aspects of digital aspects will also be discussed. Also, scenario-based situations will be provided.
