- Recognize an emergency whether it be trauma or medical related through the use of lecture and visual aids.
 Understanding the purpose and function of an Emergency Medical Services System (EMS System) through lecture.
- Explain the differences between EMS Legal and ethical issues and how to respond properly to both types of dilemmas. Focusing on what constitutes legal consent and the different types of consent as well as the purpose and function of Good Samaritan Laws.
- Demonstrate the patient assessment process and how to properly assess a conscious person for life-threatening and non-life-threatening conditions such as heart attack, stroke, seizure, etc.
- Demonstrate how to assess an injured or ill person who appears to be unresponsive.
- Demonstrate how to properly assess responsiveness as well as the presence of a pulse.
- Explain through lecture and demonstration how to recognize the signs and symptoms of a heart attack and demonstrate the proper first aid for a person who is showing these signs and symptoms.
- Explain and identify the Cardiac Chain of Survival as identified by the American Heart Association.
- Explain and demonstrate the process of Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and the proper use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) for a person in cardiac arrest.
- Explain and demonstrate the proper procedure for relieving a foreign body airway obstruction of a person who appears to be choking.
- Explain the signs and symptoms of shock and demonstrate the appropriate first aid care for a person who is showing these signs and symptoms.
- Explain and demonstrate to safely and effectively give rescue ventilations, specifically utilizing a bag valve mask (BVM) device both one rescuer and two rescuer techniques.
