Course Description

Rapid deployment/immediate action is the swift and immediate deployment of law enforcement resources to a life-threatening active threat situation. These situations require immediate action and the rapid deployment of law enforcement. Failure to act has catastrophic consequences resulting in death and/or great bodily harm to innocent people. These incidents may also necessitate the immediate and rapid deployment of personnel to contain and prevent the escape of an armed and dangerous offender or rescue a downed officer and/or civilian. This class will focus on a single officer responding to an active threat situation.

Course Objectives

- Review and study active shooter incidents where solo officer responses have been utilized
- Importance of solo officer response to be integrated into law enforcement tactics
- Know when to utilize solo officer tactics
- Discuss use of force and safety priorities related to rapid deployment/ immediate action incidents
- Learn and demonstrate solo officer movements, room clearing and firearms handling
- Participate in realistic hands on scenario based training while demonstrating techniques

Attendees are required to provide safety glasses, jacket, or heavy long sleeve shirt (for Simunition training), duty gear, ballistic vest or outer carrier, and AR–15 rifle (if carried on duty).
