Course Description

The Illinois **Safety, Accountability, Fairness & Equity – Today (SAFE-T) Act** requires law enforcement officers to receive 6 hours of training every three years on *Laws Concerning Stops, Searches and Use of Force*. This training satisfies that requirement.

Course Objectives

This course includes a detailed presentation on the following Illinois Use of Force laws, 720/ILCS 5/7:

- Defense of Person
- Defense of Dwelling
- Defense of Other Property
- Use of Force by an aggressor
- Making Arrest
- Prohibited Use of Force by a Police Officer
- What is Deadly Force
- Prevention of Escape
- Duty to Render Aid
- Duty to Intervene

Protections of the US Constitution (Specifically the 4th & 8th Amendments):

- Reasonable Use of Force
- Due Process
- Investigative (Terry) Stops
- Search Warrants

Ethical Issues:

- Excessive Use of Force
- Qualified Immunity
- Civil Liability
- Police Officer certification/de-certification
