<p>This course will measure practical marksmanship skills with the “Handgun”. The results of this course of fire will be documented with MTU 15 and officers successfully completing the course will receive a state “Certificate of Qualification”. The Course-of-Fire for this qualification is that which has been approved by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board (ILETSB) for in-service handgun qualification. There will also be a review of the ILETSB Use of Force brochure covering statutory and constitutional considerations in peace officers use of deadly force in making arrest.</p>
