Course Description

This class will provide investigators with the skills & competency to conduct and complete thorough homicide investigations with prosecutorial merit. Additionally, investigators will be provided with the skills to recognize and handle other types of death investigations.

Investigators will cover three basic steps in all homicide investigations: Crime Scene, Follow-up and Case Courtroom presentation. This class provides officers with an in-depth and step-by-step process for handling high-profile, major incidents, including cases of multiple homicides, and crimes of violence against vulnerable populations.
