Responder curriculum. This course will provide the student with the necessary tools to adequately identify not only what an Emergency Medical Services System is but also the procedure to access the system. The student will also be educated in the proper assessment steps to identify several medical emergencies as well as the proper first aid to render. During this course the student will be given the opportunity to learn certain self-aid as well as buddy-aid skills. Course Objectives					
 Recognize an emergency whether it be trauma or medical related through the use of lecture and visual aids. Understanding the purpose and function of an Emergency Medical Services System (EMS System) through lecture. Explain the differences between EMS Legal and ethical issues and how to respond properly to both types of dilemmas. Focusing on what constitutes legal consent and the different types of consent as well as the purpose and function of Good Samaritan Laws. Demonstrate the patient assessment process and how to properly assess a conscious person for life-threatening and non-life-threatening conditions such as heart attack, stroke, seizure, etc. Demonstrate how to assess an injured or ill person who appears to be unresponsive. Demonstrate how to properly assess responsiveness as well as the presence of a pulse. Explain and identify the Cardiac Chain of Survival as identified by the American Heart Association. Explain and demonstrate the proper procedure for relieving a foreign body airway obstruction of a person who appears to be choking.
