Course Description

This dynamic and fast paced course is designed to train officers in the fundamentals and tactical skill sets required during high-risk patrol operations. The focus of this program will be to provide officers with the knowledge, specialized tactical skill sets, and strategic understanding to be able to manage and perform three critical high-risk patrol functions: building searches, felony traffic stops, and arrest team tactics. This course provides officers with the foundational knowledge and tactical skills necessary to safely manage these types of incidents.

Course Objectives

- Provide students an understanding of why high-risk operations were developed and the need for them to be integrated in their daily patrol activities
- To identify and discuss use-of-force and safety priority issues related to high-risk patrol incidents, including immediate defense of life
- Students will be provided knowledge of proper equipment for high-risk patrol operations, including weapons, ammunitions selection and uniform/ identifications requirements
- Students will demonstrate a practical knowledge and performance ability in conducting high-risk patrol operations
- Students will participate in realistic scenario-based training
- Students will learn and practice skill sets necessary for: Building searches; Room clearing; Use of cover; Vehicle stops; Vehicle clearing; and Suspect custody

Equipment Requirements

Attendees are required to provide safety glasses, jacket, or heavy long sleeve shirt (for Simunition training), duty gear, pistol, flashlight ballistic vest or outer carrier, and AR–15 rifle with sling (if carried on duty), ballistic shields and helmets if available. Students should also bring a notebooks, pens and hydration.
