Course Description

This end user medical officer course will train police officers how to recognize signs of medical emergencies and better enable them to perform lifesaving medical techniques. This comprehensive training program integrates first aid, safety education, and the Stop the Bleed initiative, focusing on injury treatment and emergency care for accidents, injuries and sudden illnesses.

This course will also help officers stay current on the required Emergency Medical Response mandates each year.

Course Objectives

Class objectives include understanding:

- ✓ Application of basic life-saving skills
- ✓ Recognizing the signs and symptoms of medical issues
- ✓ Understanding the basics of CPR/ EAD practices (This is not a CPR/AED class)
