Course Description

This three-day, 24-hour course is designed to train officers to perform rapid deployment/ immediate action tactics. Rapid deployment/ immediate action is the swift and immediate deployment of law enforcement resources to an ongoing, life-threatening "active threat" situation. These situations require immediate action and the rapid deployment of police officers. Failure to act could have catastrophic consequences resulting in death and/or great bodily harm to innocent people. These incidents may also necessitate the immediate and rapid deployment of personnel to contain and prevent the escape of an armed and dangerous offender or rescue a downed officer and/or civilian.

Course Objectives

- Team formation and room clearing
- Conventional barricade hostage tactics
- Integrated tactics: first responders, contact, and rescue teams
- · Use of Force and safety priorities
- Equipment and identification requirements
- Explosive devices
- Integration of multiple agency responses
- · Verbal skills
- · Deployment and firearms handling
