This presentation will also utilize the Use of Force Guidelines and the Illinois Mandatory Firearms Training Manual produced by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board; the Law Enforcement Liability Update; and the Use of Force Quarterly produced by the Illinois Prosecutor Services, LLC.
