Course Description

This course addresses law enforcement legal use of force statutory law, including up-to-date case law decisions by higher courts. This class uses videos of officer involved shooting cases that the instructor has personally handled. This training will focus on Supreme Court decisions and Federal Appeals cases. This class will give officers a better understanding of how to make good Use of Force decisions on the street.
