Course Description

This training provides information and techniques to be followed in the search for and control of contraband. It also standardizes procedure for the inspection and search of a detainee's person, living quarters, or any area in or around a Correctional Facility to aid in the control of contraband. Additionally, the course reveals to participants that searching a detainee's person is sound correctional practice and a necessary element of contraband control. The employee will learn the importance of thoroughness and not to offend the dignity of the detainee being searched.

Course Objectives

Class objectives include understanding:

- Name two purposes for a search
- Define contraband
- Identify four major categories of contraband
- Name three types of searches
- Perform a body search
- Approach and Verbal De-escalation techniques
- Identify the procedure for a strip search
- Identify different categories of people to be searched & type of searches to which they are subject.
- Define body search
- Identify the procedure for disposal of contraband.
- Complete cell, area, and personal search exercise.
