Course Description

Every year numerous law enforcements officers and civilians are killed and severely injured as a result of emergency response vehicle crashes. Historically, events involving law enforcement emergency response driving result in higher loss and liability to police agencies than any other types of events.

This is a hands-on, behind-the-wheel class designed to train the trainer to impart critical emergency response driving skills to police officers, preparing them for these situations and reducing the numbers of deaths and injuries in those emergency response driving situations. The class is designed to test and evaluate each student's abilities to perform and articulate the skills necessary to instruct others in the high-performance operation of an emergency vehicle. This will be accomplished through classroom and field instruction, physical skill testing, role playing, and course designing. Students will operate as individuals and small teams throughout this training.

Course Objectives

Students will be subjected to and must be able to demonstrate verbally & physically, and understanding and proficiency in each of the following categories:

- ✓ Legal Obligations
- ✓ Vehicle Dynamics
- ✓ Low Speed Vehicle Maneuvering
- ✓ Lines of Travel
- ✓ High Speed Vehicle Maneuvering

Instructor

Greg Parquette, is a certified driving instructor who has taught throughout the US and abroad. His work in this field started while he was with the ISP where he became an Emergency Vehicle Operations Course instructor. He was assigned to the Illinois State Police Academy where he became a full-time drivers' training instructor, eventually becoming the Lead Instructor and Coordinator for the program. Under his leadership, the program solidified its place as a national leader in the field of driving instruction. Greg has received advanced instruction in driving from such organizations as the Oklahoma Highway Patrol, Colorado Highway Patrol, the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC, Glynco, Ga.), the Bob Bondurant School of High-Performance driving and many others. Since retiring from the ISP in 2010, Greg has worked with the Ford Motor Company as a pro driver, demonstrating, testing, and evaluating multiple vehicle platforms. Throughout his career Greg has had the opportunity to train and demonstrate to heads of state, dignitaries, elite military units, and law enforcement officers of all ranks.
