### Course Description

The goal of this presentation is to offer guidance to Illinois Law Enforcement agencies in dealing with the Safety, Accountability, Fairness & Equity – Today (SAFE-T) Act of 2021. Recently enacted, this act creates massive overhaul of the Criminal Justice System in Illinois which affects many existing laws which will drastically impact how law enforcement officers will do their jobs in Illinois. The complexities of this new law will require four years to fully implement. As with many new laws, there is the letter of the law then there are processes of how that law will be carried out. The systems as to how this law are currently being developed. That development is primarily the responsibility of the Illinois Law Enforcement Training & Standards Board.
