Course Description

School Resource Officers are required to take a 16-hour SRO Refresher course, every two years. This School Resource Officer Refresher course is intended for current SRO's whose certifications need to be updated, to prevent them from expiring.

The final day of this 2-day class will be devoted to the necessary Active Threat Response training utilizing force-on-force scenarios. This will require participants to provide protective equipment including a thick long-sleeve shirt or jacket, gloves, and safety glasses. Officers should also bring all duty belt gear, excluding all weapons (firearms, TASERS, OC Spray, knives, etc.).

She has developed a curriculum that meets State requirements for the certification of juvenile police officers. She provides training for the Cook County Adult

Probation Department, Illinois Crisis Intervention Team and Homeland Security, as well as MTUs across the state of Illinois.
