### Course Description

This interactive workshop reviews multiple methods of Fact Gathering and utilizes practical exercises, new concepts/techniques, as well as psychological principles to enhance the law enforcement officer's ability to obtain legally acceptable confessions and to tailor their criminal interviews for maximum advantage. The purpose of the course is to offer participants, who have attended a basic introductory interview and interrogation course, with an opportunity to practice techniques in a workshop environment. This interactive workshop allows participants to work through actual case studies applying techniques taught by the instructor in real-world situations.

**PREREQUISITE: To participate in the Advanced Workshop, an individual must have previously attended the WZ Seminar on Criminal Interview & Interrogation, OR other formal interview & interrogation training.**
