Course Description

This class will provide police officers and firefighter/paramedics training that will enable them to operate together as a team in the warm zone during an active threat situation. This will provide them the skillsets they need to rapidly perform critical lifesaving medical procedures and triage under the force protection of law enforcement. It has been proven that treating victims with traumatic injuries quickly, increases their chance of survival. This class will demonstrate the importance of accessing victims early to increase the probability of survival to seriously injured victims.

Course Objectives

- ✓ Ensure students have an excellent understanding of rescue task force tactics and strategy
- ✓ Ensure students understand their individual roles on the RTF teams
- ✓ Provide an inventory of appropriate equipment to be used when performing a mission
- ✓ Participate in realistic scenarios and demonstrate their ability to perform RTF skills
- ✓ Understand and embrace the concept of tactical emergency treatment
- ✓ Recognize and identify tactical zones of operations (cold, warm, hot)
- ✓ Understand interior and exterior patient collection points and patient movement protocols

All students should bring ballistic safety glasses and regular duty gear. Optional items to bring: ballistic vest that would normally be worn and an AR-15 if authorized by your department. **NO LIVE AMMO or PISTOLS, or other weapons will be allowed in the class.**
